

## Join us to celebrate National Trails Day!

On **June 6, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.**, several trail advocacy groups will gather at the Pend d'Oreille Winery lawn (on the corner of Cedar and 3rd Street in Sandpoint) with goodies and information on how you can enjoy our great outdoors and/or support trail building in our community.

Saturday and Sunday, June 6 and 7, the following activities are scheduled:

**Saturday, June 6** - Native Plant Walk along the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail. Learn about efforts to make this shoreline path a public trail and enjoy the native plants that live along it.
